SYNOPSIS

What's the buzz? The first musical by Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Webber to be produced for the professional stage, Jesus Christ Superstar has wowed audiences for over 50 years. A timeless work, the rock opera is set against the backdrop of an extraordinary and universally known series of events but seen, unusually, through the eyes of Judas Iscariot. Loosely based on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, Superstar follows the last week of Jesus Christ's life.

The story, told entirely through song, explores the personal relationships and struggles between Jesus, Judas, Mary Magdalene, his disciples, his followers and the Roman Empire.

The iconic 1970s rock score contains such well-known numbers as "Superstar," "I Don't Know How to Love Him" and "Gethsemane." A true global phenomenon, *Superstar* continues to touch new generations of audiences and performers.

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Jesus Christ Superstar is a foundational show for me - I played Caiaphas (the High Priest) when I was 17 and my entire family appeared alongside me. Now, 22 years later, I'm directing the show and my father is a member of the cast.

The time to put on a production of *Jesus Christ Superstar* is now. This show explores the life of one of the loudest voices for compassion in human history - and we desperately need more compassion in the world.

There are many parallels that can be drawn between Jesus' treatment at the hands of the Romans and how he would be treated online and in the media if he returned today. Speaking up for those without voices, preaching kindness over isolationism, rejecting the concept of individual wealth in favor of community, stating emphatically that borders are imaginary because kingdoms and nations are concepts not realities - these ideas are as politically explosive now as they were two thousand years ago.

This timelessness inspired our production's visual language. Without changing a word of the lyrics, or any of the intention or the characters, I'm attempting to draw visual parallels between then and now. As the show progresses, the visuals shift from modern to historical, because there are limits to be drawn in this comparison. We are not literally crucifying people for their opinions here in Canada, but the metaphor is still apt.

Exploring themes that are as important now as they were two thousand years ago, via one of the best musicals of the last fifty years is a dream. I cannot thank the MAT, or our incredible cast, enough for this opportunity.

Whether this is your first time seeing JCS, or your hundredth, I hope you leave having found something new.

A STUDY IN COSTUMES AND COLOUR

Erin Hawke, Costume Designer for MAT's Jesus Christ Superstar

Designing costumes for this production has been a big bucket list item, and also an interesting challenge. When Ryan approached me several years ago about his vision I knew I had to carefully create a visual story to solidify his narrative. Colour had to become a key player, singling out our characters and lending a deeper meaning to their roles. Yellow for confidence and hope, red for justice and sacrifice, orange for energy and action, black for death and power.

Along with colour, there was also the matter of the desire to shift from a modern approach to this story to a more historic visual by the end. I eventually landed on each costume shift being a deeply personal character epiphany, rather than a moment dictated only by the script. A character would only change once they believe, truely, deep down, that Jesus is 'the real deal'.

For some characters this change is sudden and deliberate, like Mary. For some it happens accidentally as the propaganda and fear settles in them, like our priests and guards. For some it happens too late, like with our Apostles. The only change we never see is Judas, who maintains throughout that Jesus is just his friend, just a man, whose philosophies have been blown out of control by his followers. It's not until the end when Judas is faced with the consequences of his actions that we see him with a glimmer of true belief, but by then it's too late.

"Who are you? What have you sacrificed?"

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

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A NOTE FROM THE MUSICAL DIRECTOR

When I was a teenager, the first time I heard *Jesus Christ Superstar*, I was hooked. As someone raised in the Catholic faith, I already knew the story—but hearing it told through the driving force of rock music made it come alive inside me in a whole new way. I played "Caiaphas" in that production, and I remember being struck by the complexity of his character, the emotional depth of the music—and the insane vocal range I needed (but definitely didn't have at the time).

Now, many years later, I'm still hooked—and so honored to serve as the musical director for this production on our beloved Gordon Lightfoot Stage. Bringing this powerful rock opera to life with such a passionate and dedicated band and cast is pure joy—and a full-circle moment I hold close to my heart. Music has always been more than notes on a page to me—it's connection, transformation, and storytelling at its most human. My deepest hope is that this production leaves a lasting imprint on everyone who experiences it, reminding us of the beauty, the struggle, and the spirit that unites us all.

Finally, I want to thank my husband and children for giving me the time and support to pursue this dream—and for keeping our own "finely tuned band" playing strong in my absence.
